During Pond Corps, the trusses were secured on top of the posts and the plywood was nailed into place to cover the pavilion. The roof was not planned to be nailed during Pond Corps, but the tremendous amount of help made it possible. Highway cleanup and general maintenance of Goose Pond also occurred during Pond Corps. The trail from the Dining Hall to the Pavilion Project was covered with gravel and surveyed for upkeep. This past weekend, the concrete pad was poured and work from the previous week on the pavilion was inspected. Due to the major advances on the Pavilion Project over the past few weeks, the projected completion date is back to the original schedule of early June. The final work to be done on the project is placing the shingles and general cleanup of the area. I would like to thank everyone that has given their time to the project over the past few months. WANT A CHANCE TO WIN A SUPER COOL AWARD?

Look no further than the Pemachpin Award! Instituted by the Lodge Executive Committee at the beginning of 2010, the Pemachpin, meaning, "to be present" in the Lenni Lenape language, Award's purpose is to increase membership involvement over the course of the year. There are several requirements for this award, and, once completed, your card can be handed into the Lodge Officers/Advisors no later than the November General Lodge Meeting. Then, at the Holiday Banquet all members who have received the award will be honored with a patch and certificate. It's really a fun way for you to get involved! Last year we challenged at least 66% of the LEC to receive the award, and 79% did, along with several general lodge members. This year, we want many more of our general lodge members to receive this award! This means YOU. Many of you have a lot of these requirements already accomplished for the year, so keep staying active with the lodge and urge your fellow brothers to participate! Look at the requirements below, and at an upcoming lodge event ask the officers for a Pemachpin Award card:

- Have current lodge dues paid.
- If a lodge flap is worn on your uniform, wear the proper current flap.
- Serve on a lodge committee (i.e. Ceremonies, NAA, Food, etc.)
- Attend 2 Lodge Executive Committee meetings.
- Participate in at least one work weekend of the major Lodge Service project.
- Attend 1 entire Ordeal weekend.
- Take your brotherhood, if you are eligible to do so.
- Youth attend 4 and Adults attend 6 of the following in Uniform if appropriate:
 - 1. Camp Work Day
 - 2. November General Lodge Meeting
 - 3. Section Conclave
 - 4. Fellowship Weekend
 - 5. Lodge Picnic
 - 6. Harvestfest
 - 7. Adopt-A-Highway
 - 8. Merit Badge College
 - 9. National Event (i.e. NOAC, OA High Adventure, NLS, etc.)
 - 10. Lodge Leadership Development

HELP LOWWAPANEU GO GREEN!

As Boy Scouts, we do a lot of nifty, environmentally friendly things, but the Officers of Lowwapaneu believe we can do more. Lowwapaneu Lodge has a brigade from TerraCycle, which is an international company whose main objective is to minimize and reduce waste by collecting items that typically end up in landfills and upcycling them into new products. Such examples of upcycled products include Capri Sun backpacks for kids, Cliff Bar duffle bags for athletes, and even Oreo packaging laptop bags. Over 20 million people are participating in this program in over 14 countries, and Lowwapaneu is now proud to be a part of this initiative!

The Officers are collecting items for TerraCycle at any Lodge event, such as an LEC on the fourth Wednesday of every month, or any of the Ordeals. Also, inside both the trading posts at Goose Pond and Camp Acahela there will be TerraCycle collection boxes during the 2012 camp season. Several OA members working at our council's camps will be in charge of the collections. Here is a list of items that can be collected:

- Writing Instruments (pens, pencils, markers, sharpies, highlighters)
- Empty chip bags and energy bar/granola bar wrappers, candy bar wrappers
- Computer mice, keyboards, GPS devices, cell phones, laptops, graphing calculators, MP3 Players
 Ink and Toner Cartridges
 - Old Pairs of Shoes
 - Used toothbrushes, empty toothpaste tubes, lipstick and powder cases

For each of these items we collect, we receive a unique point value. Every point equates to \$0.01, which can later be redeemed for a donation of our choice. Since one of our themes for the year is "toning up and preparing for the future" we hope to raise money over the next three years through this program to help create an OA High Adventure and NOAC Scholarship for 2015! This cannot happen without your help. Start collecting today and assist Lowwapaneu in preparing for our future endeavors. 




This is duffle bag TerraCycle made out of upcycled Cliff Bar wrappers.
